Excerpt from the Friends of the Canadian War Museum Newsletter DR JACK GRANATSTEIN TO BE MUSEUM CHIEF

The well-known historian, author and academic, Dr Jack Granatstein will become Director and Chief Executive Officer of the Canadian War Museum on 1 July 1998. A graduate of Le College Militaire Royale de St-Jean and the Royal Military College (BA, 1961) he attained his MA from the University of Toronto in 1962 and his PhD from Duke University in 1966. He is currently Distinguished Research Professor of History Emeritus at York University, a member of RMC's board of governors, and a Fellow at the Canadian Institute of International Affairs.

His more than 30 books published over the last thirty years include: Bloody Victory: Canadians and the D-Day Campaign; The Collins Dictionary of Canadian History; Marching to Victory; Canadians and the Great War; A Nation Forged in Fire: Canadians and the Second World War; The Generals: The Canadian Army's Senior Commanders in the Second World War; and The Veterans Charter and Post-World War II Canada.

Dr Granatstein broadcast extensively from Europe during the 50th anniversary ceremonies commemorating D-Day and VE Day, and gives frequent media comments on defence, public affairs and historical questions. In 1996 he was the recipient of the Vimy Award which each year honours the Canadian who made the most significant contribution to the defence and security of Canada and to the preservation of our democratic values. In 1997 he was an advisor to the Minister of National Defence on the future of the Canadian Forces and was one of the three members of the Special Commission on the Restructuring of the Canadian Forces Reserves.

He was appointed an Officer of the Order of Canada in 1997.

Fortunately the episode ended happily entirely to the credit of Mr. Arthur Lee, philanthropic Canadian from Toronto. A book has been published by Dianne Graves, wife of OMMC Inc. member Don Graves, entitled A Crown of Life : The World of John McCrae. The hard cover book of 300 pages is a thoroughly researched book with many foot notes and an extensive bibliography. The extent of the capabilities of John McCrae are unbelievable as his life history is unfolded. He was a very talented doctor, a deep-thinking poet and philosopher, and a dedicated soldier. If you do not read this book you will be doing yourself a disfavour. It is well edited and I only perceived 3 typing errors in the 300 pages. When the book is reprinted Dianne will have to add a chapter dealing with the auction of this great Canadian's medals.
